Rationale and Background

- The new RDP of EU moves away from the axes structure
 - Priority 6: Social inclusion, poverty reduction and economic development in rural areas
 - More decentralisation and devolution of power to local communities - CLLD
- Important developments in agricultural policy in the Western Balkans in recent years as well...
 - an intensive political process on preparation and adaptation of a strategic and programming documents
 - rural development policy is an increasingly important component
 - the CAP-type programming framework, the harmonisation of specific policy instruments...



Rationale and Background

- Less is known about the current state of LEADER and/or LEADER-like initiatives in Western Balkan!
 - How do policy makers and local stakeholders deal with the policy instrument that extensively relies on local initiative?
 - How are they successful in managing a new method of territorial governance?



Objectives

Overall objective:

 To improve understanding of the current state and the barriers for effective implementation of LEADER initiative

Specific objectives:

- To present the current state of LEADER in country / territory in WB from the perspective of:
 - cross-country comparative analysis of the policy, regulatory and institutional framework;
 - To assess the available funds from public sources and donors;
 - Review practical activities already undertaken to identify good practice from previous actions and initiatives and lessons learned;
- To draw conclusions by generalizing from the findings on the specific national needs, challenges and constrains



Method (1)

Facts finding - desk research!

- Systematic assessment of releavnt national documents, according to the instructions given in template:
 - policy documents, laws, regulations
- All relevant information and data that have been already collected or recorded
 - research papers, reports, studies, etc.
- Look as well outside of the sources of Ministry of Agriculture
 - websites of national, local and regional institutions, academia, donor projects, CSOs...
- Provide the list of references in annex;
 - Separate authorised documents, web sources, legal and policy documents etc.;



Method (2)

Understanding the state of art - Interview with identified resource person!

- Characteristics for identifying stakeholders:
 - Responsibility and position;
 - Knowledge level of the domain / experience level of the domain?
 - Leadership role and influence, control over information, resources ...
- Representative(s) of the Ministry of Agriculture or other relevant Governmental body;
- Other relevant resource person(s) where needed



Method (3)

Illustrate by an example - Case study!

- Check out some of the stories from the communities, LAGs, Networks
- Illustrate the diversity of:
 - contexts,
 - approaches,
 - types of partnerships and institutions developed.
