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alignment and simplification exercise

- Alignement to Lisbonne Treaty(2009), splitting in DA and IA of existing legislation
- Simplification: clearer legal framework, decrease error rate in implementation by MS and reduce administrative burden(high number of notifications, controls)

Commission level legislation

R607/2009 on PDO/PGI procedures, traditional terms procedure and wine labelling and presentation: single text(1DA,1 IA):discussion continues in expert group on single text, need for TBT notification and BRP(better regulation portal): some key issues

R436/2009 on vineyard register, accompanying documents and cellar records , will incorporate the DA/IA 2015/560-561 on new autorisation scheme:discussion in expert group closed, text to be finalised and to be put in procedure: still 'technical complex' legislation, Q3 2017

R606/2009: oenological practices, reflexion ongoing

proposal of Commission to EP/Council to amend R1308/2013

and other acts, 'omnibus proposal , 1st reading in Council 02/03/2017



Regulatory framework

- The new system of vine authorisations:
 - Will run <u>from 2016 until 2030</u>, be more open and less restrictive than the planting rights regime
 - Instead of "prohibition of vine plantings", 1% increase of new plantings/year, with a possibility for MS where justified to establish lower limits at national or PDO/PGI level, authorisations with no cost to producers but non-transferable
 - > In 2016:

17158ha authorisations for new plantings(25632ha available)

11,223 ha authorisations for replantings

63,408ha authorisations from converted planting rights






Wine National Envelopes 2009-2018 by Member State

FIC R1169/2011

- Article 15:language requirements
 - 1.mandatory food information shall appear in a language easily understood by the consumers of the Member States where a food is marketed.
- 2. Within their own territory, the Member States in which a food is marketed may stipulate that the particulars shall be given in one or more languages from among the official languages of the Union



FIC R 1169/2011

Article 16:ingredient and nutrition labelling

4. ...a list of ingredients or a mandatory nutrition declaration...shall not be mandatory for beverages containing more than 1,2 % by volume of alcohol.

By 13 December 2014, the Commission shall produce a reportand addressing whether alcoholic beverages should in future be covered, in particular, by the requirement to provide the information on the energy value, and the reasons justifying possible exemptions, taking into account the need to ensure coherence with other relevant Union policies....
