












Results and experiences from the first call of ABD Grant Scheme within LEIWW Programme

22-23 September 2016, Kolašin, Montenegro



Background

The ABD Grant Scheme within LEIWW Programme is follow-up of the ABD Grant Scheme implemented by SWG in 2014 and 2015 under the project "Preparation for implementation of the Area Based Development (ABD) Approach in the Western Balkans – 2nd Phase" funded by the European Union.


The overall objective of the project was to continue the process of building capacities and structures within the SWG and within selected regions as a preparation for the implementation of the forthcoming Area Based Development (ABD) programmes.

Pilot ABD Grant Scheme was implemented in the crossborder regions Drina-Tara and Drina-Sava focusing on income generation through partnership among operators in different value chains.



The 1st ABD Grant Scheme within LEIWW Programme is designed to support small projects in the cross-border regions "Drina-Tara", "Drina-Sava" + "Prespa" and "Sharra" related to income generation by improvement of production processes, technology and quality of products and services in "green" value chains (tourism, agriculture, etc), promoting sustainable use of natural resources and integrated water and forest resources management.

Special attention is devoted to the economic activities of women and young people in the cross-border areas.



Support to: CSO, Municipalities, Individual businesses, cooperatives, local value chains in the cross-border regions in preparation of quality project proposals and business plans/strategies in line with the objectives of the ABD Grant Scheme



The SWG ABD staff along with the engaged international expert for overall supervisory of the ABD Grant Scheme and regional experts on business plan and environment have worked on update of eligibility criteria, application procedures, guidelines for applicants and template documents for applicants according to the objectives of the ABD Strategic documents and LEIWW Programme.

Promotion and facilitation of the ABD Grant Scheme in the cross-border regions "Drina-Tara", "Drina-Sava", "Prespa" and "Sharra" was done by the ABD PMU's within the ongoing European Union funded project "Fostering regional cooperation and balanced territorial development of Western Balkan countries in the process towards ELL integration"



The finalized documents were presented on the specific coaching and training session for engaged local experts and ABD team in the cross-border regions Prespa, Sharra, Drina-Tara and Drina-Sava which was organized in the period 16-17 May 2016 in Belgrade, Serbia.

The first ABD Grant Scheme call within LEIWW Programme was opened on 27th May 2016 and the closing date was on 06th July 2016. (41 day)

Proper visibility and outreach was insured with announcements in national/regional media (newspapers, TV, etc.). **Ten (10) info days and additional capacity building activities** for the potential applicants were organized during the SHG



Evaluation Process


Analysis 1 – Administrative check, checking the timeliness, completeness of application (process done by ABD Staff in PMU's)

Analysis 2 – 3 step evaluation process done by SWG Delegates, nominated representatives from the ministries and external experts

- Evaluation of relevance, evaluation of gender, partnership and other criteria
- Evaluation of Business plan/strategy
- Evaluation of environmental criteria (Supplement documents/explanations could be requested after Analysis 1 and 2)

On Spot control – verification of factual situation

Final Decision – refusal or approval (process done in SWG HQ)



Evaluation Process till now


Analysis 1 – After completion of Analysis 1, 31 applications have progressed into Analysis 2 Only 6 applications were fully completed and no supplement documents or information were required.

Analysis 2 – ON-GOING

On Spot control – ON-GOING and expected to be completed till end of September

Final Decision – Expected to be completed till end of September

Contracting – Expected to be completed first half of October




Future activities

Implementation, final on spot control and final payment – upon finalization of contractual obligations but not later then February 2017

Possible 2nd ABD Grant Scheme call within LEIWW Programme for Prespa and Sharra cross-border regions

- to be opened mid of October and closed end of November
- Evaluation process and contracting to be done by end of January 2017
- Implementation and final payment by April 2017



Types of projects that could be supported under the ABD Grant Scheme

- Investments in reconstruction and improvement of touristic capacities and services;
- Investments in improvement of primary agricultural production process and marketing;
- Investments in improvement of processing of agricultural and other food and forest products;
