

General Objective: Streamline effective EU accession process for SEE candidate and potential candidate countries

- Promote peace, stability and economic development in the SEE countries;
- Support reform processes for proper implementation of the Enlargement Policy;
- Foster progress in the areas of agriculture and rural development in line with its Member states' and EU priorities.
- Active contributor to the International and Regional Agendas for sustainable development and integration (Agenda 2030 and SDGs, Western Balkan Strategy for Enlargement and Sofia Declaration).

Objective 1: further enhance regional cooperation processes as a boost to EU integration

- Facilitate regional policy/political dialogues and platforms on topics of need among the SEE countries (APF, MM);
- Develop declarations and political statements to foster cooperation practices;
- Increase political commitment to multi-stakeholder approach governing and efficient EU approximation processes;

- Support to development and use of digital tools;
- Increase involvement of women and youth in entrepreneurial initiatives and start ups;
- Include aquaculture in the rural development cross-cutting measures.

Result: Rural businesses and entrepreneurs in selected value chains are more competitive on the local and regional markets due to increased technical support programs and measures

Objective 4: Environmental innovation towards sustainable rural development

- To achieve the target measures for its strategy, SWG is keep on following the framework for **European Green Deal and Farm-to-Fork 2030**, in particularly focusing on:
- a) Sustainable use of natural resources;
- b) Conservation of biodiversity and provision of Ecosystem services;
- c) Circular economy in rural areas (solid waste management).





Implementation

- The Secretary General is responsible for facilitation of the work on the Strategy and lead the implementation process, coordinate the Secretariat and the regional offices and foster joint actions among the Member institutions.
- The implementation period from 2021-2022 will give the SWG an opportunity to align and amend the activities proceeding with the Strategy and initiate some other actions that will better suite the needs of the SWG members and stakeholders.

At the end of 2022, during the SWG annual Assembly the Delegates will determine if the Strategy is following the right path and needed target measures of the SEE countries or if modifications are needed. If changes to be applied, a new draft Strategy is to be proposed on the next SWG Assembly.
